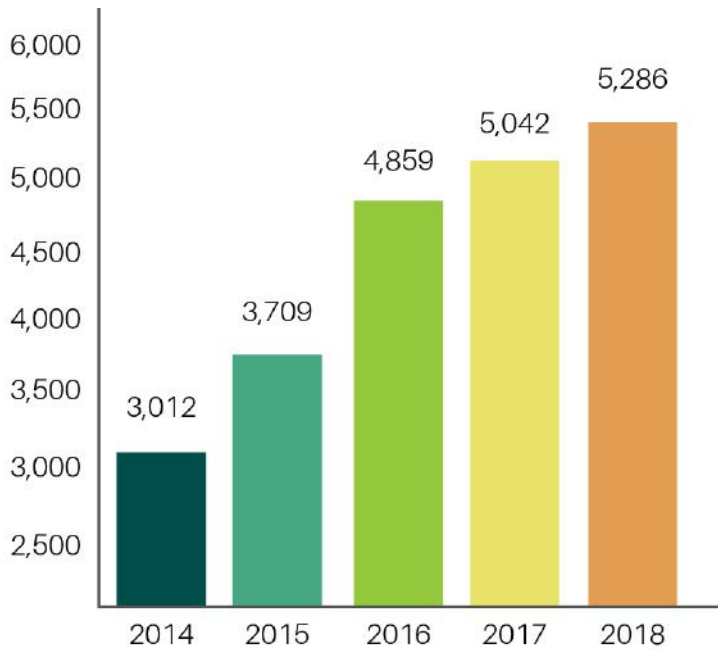

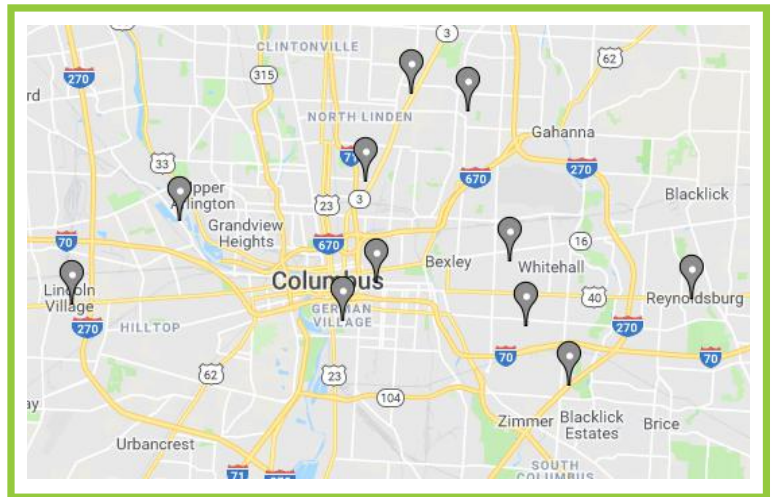
Our Reach

52% of our families are living in central Ohio's poorest neighborhoods

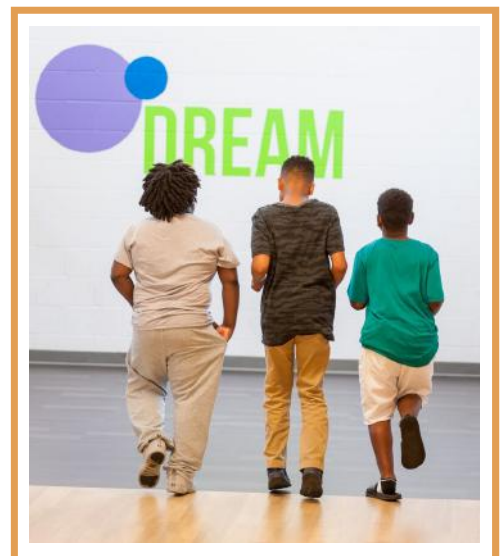
77% of our families on average report experiencing trauma consistent with ACE's (Adverse Childhood Experiences)

We supported **5,286** children and families with expert behavioral healthcare services.



We served **nearly 100,000** meals to children struggling with food insecurity.



We graduated **96%** of preschoolers and **97%** of elementary students from St. Vincent Prep Academy.



We transported more than **200** students each day to and from St. Vincent Prep Academy.



We trained **280%** more foster parents to support children without a place to call home.



We provided school supplies for **all** SVFC student clients in need.

We are so grateful for our community partners who support the success of our SVFC children and families each year!

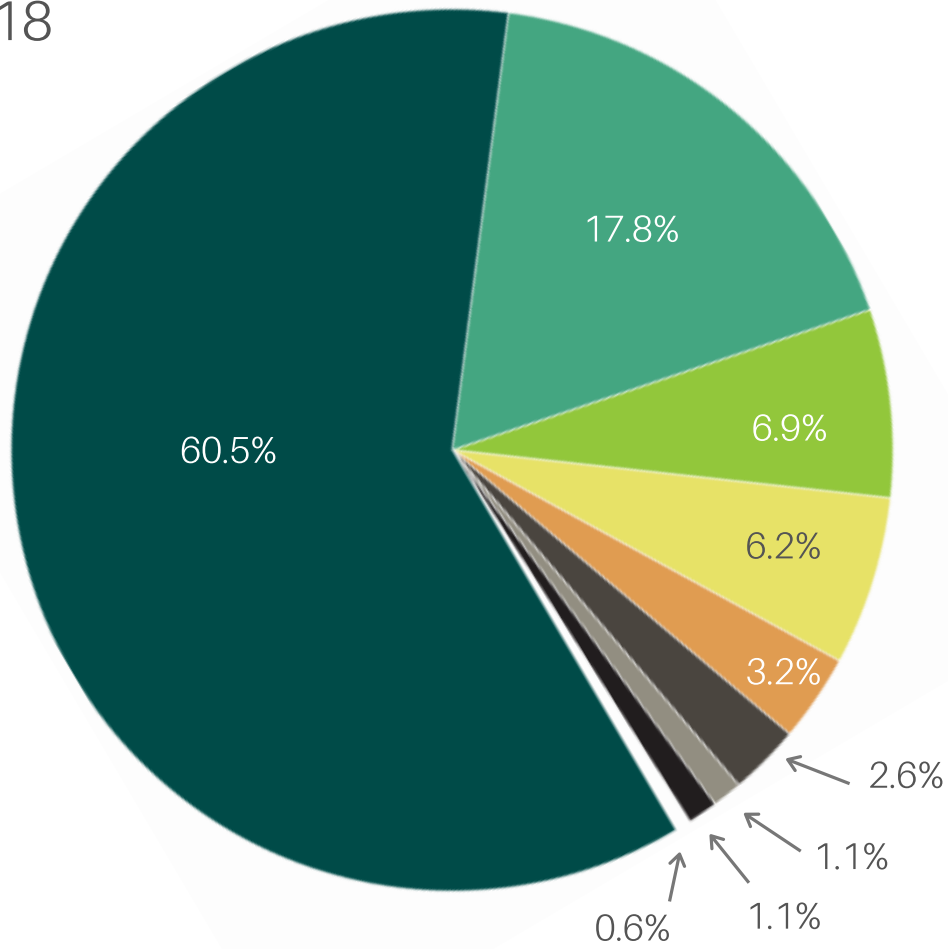


We welcomed more than 260 community volunteers who completed nearly 750 hours of work to support our ongoing needs!
